Purpose:


To inform health professionals from various backgrounds of mental health issues and interventions specific to long term care.

- 10) Identify one of the alternative models of Recreational Therapy interventions and explain why it would be effective with your residents.
- 11) Define empathy and other active listening skills.
- 12) Discuss the importance and applicability of active listening skills in long term care settings.
- 13) Describe the impact of empathy responses and active listening behaviors on the communication process.
